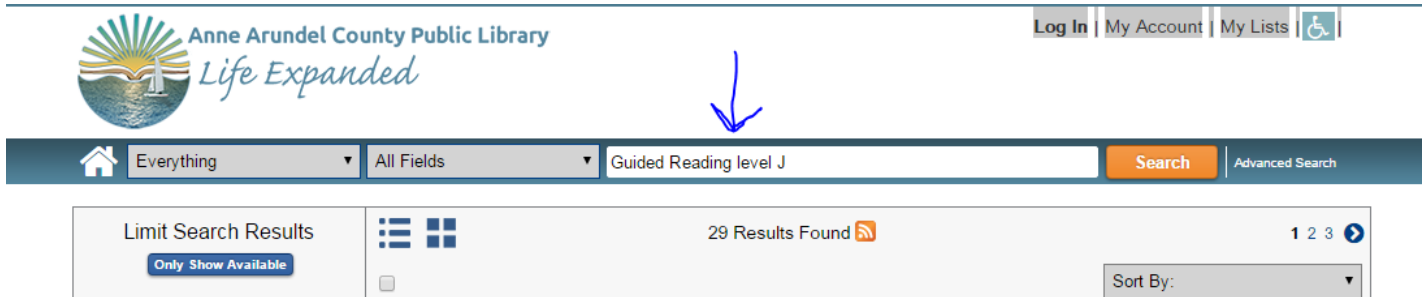
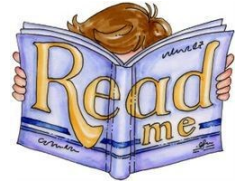


How can I find books on my child's reading level?

- ⇒ Let your child choose titles they are interested in and enjoy reading!



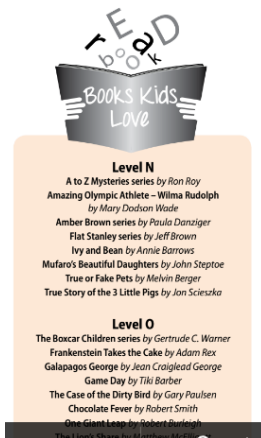
