Monarch Academy Annapolis serves students in prekindergarten through fifth grade offering both traditional in-person programming and eSchool @ Monarch Academy Annapolis, a permanent, blended-distance-learning option with 80% virtual and up to 20% in-classroom instruction. Monarch Academy Annapolis blends Transformation Education with the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme and is guided by the belief that the school culture is integral to creating a sense of caring, commitment and critical thinking in our students. These proven methods are tailored to the uniqueness of the Annapolis community, one rich in diversity and cultural heritage.

The arts are infused into our curriculum and supported by an arts integration resource teacher dedicated to working directly with students and teachers. There is a focus on multi-intelligences and the use of multiple perspectives when problem-solving. Our students collaborate and are encouraged to question, explore and think creatively. They have opportunities to increase their independence and leadership skills, set and meet goals and experience learning in an outdoor classroom and multiple outdoor play spaces.

WHAT ARE PUBLIC CHARTER AND CONTRACT SCHOOLS?

Charter and contract schools are independent, tuition-free and publically funded schools that are open to all students, regardless of testing or screening, yet follow the same laws and regulations as public schools. These schools give families more educational choices, enabling parents to choose to send their child to a school that is compatible with what their child needs to be successful academically. Charter schools are open to all students who live in the district. Contract schools are similar to charter schools except they give preference to designated attendance boundaries.

DISCOVERING THE IMPACT OF MARINE LIFE

Monarch Academy Glen Burnie

Monarch Academy Glen Burnie's fifth-grade expedition was devoted to the study of the eastern oyster. Our students were excited by the many opportunities for hands-on learning it provided, including the creation of several types of man-made oyster reefs which will be deployed into the Chesapeake Bay. Students studied marine organisms and their habitats at Horn Point, on the Choptank River, and explored the waterways of the Chesapeake Bay by boat. Monarch Academy Glen Burnie partnered with the Annapolis Maritime Museum and introduced students to experts to build their knowledge. They participated in numerous activities to increase community awareness about the importance of the eastern oyster. They made interactive felt boards featuring marine organisms which were donated to the museum for use in their educational programs. They also met officers of the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and spent an afternoon in a courtroom listening to DNR cases. Students were encouraged to take risks, collaborate and persevere, and to see the value of responsibility as they assumed the role of being the voice for the eastern oyster – all while meeting the standards and expectations of fifth grade.

LEARNING BY DOING

Monarch Academy Annapolis

Educating the whole child is a passion of the teaching teams at Monarch Academy Annapolis. Our teachers provide opportunities for students to take control of their learning, and our hallways reflect the unique, enriched learning environments and child-centered instructional strategies designed to transform the way our students experience learning. Coupled with the Primary Years Programme framework, teachers have flexibility in how they achieve standards-based outcomes, and it shows.

Homemade polling stations with rolls of "I voted" stickers sit outside the third-grade

classrooms as part of a unit called "Election Expressions." Graphs of student surveys on a variety of topics from class pet names to future playground equipment hang on the walls. A first-grade unit on storytelling generated patchwork quilts, sewn by parents. Narrative essays next to the quilts explain the symbols each student selected for their quilt square. Kindergarteners design boats as they learn about motion, and the unit culminates with an annual regatta that parents are invited to attend.

Our teachers engage with parents, and the community at large, in the learning process. Creativity and community are becoming the hallmarks of this fast-growing school.

STUDENTS INSPIRED BY REAL-WORLD ISSUES

Monarch Global Academy Laurel

“Our sixth-graders were inspired by the United Nations’ Sustainable Development Goals for their culminating project, which is called Primary Years Programme Expedition (PYPX) in the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Programme,” says Monarch Global Academy Laurel Principal Donna O’Shea. The sixth-grade PYPX was launched with an Action Fair, and participation by local experts from organizations such as the SPCA and Hungry Harvest galvanized student action and advocacy. Students worked

alongside like-minded mentors to research real-world issues in small inquiry groups where they examined a wide range of topics from global warming to discrimination. One group even traveled to Washington, D.C., to interview a law firm about current issues and laws surrounding discrimination. Students then pursued self-driven community action activities, which included volunteering at local races and neighborhood clean-ups and resulted in a series of presentations to the local community. “Our Collaborative

Student Inquiry class is a natural transition for seventh-graders,” says Ms. O’Shea. Using project-based learning and the Transformation Education emphasis on identity, entrepreneurship, leadership and environments, students develop quarterly projects. The seventh grade explored digital footprints and identity. Student projects included hosting a Shark Tank-like event, launching social movement websites and producing an educational film festival on the nine elements of digital citizenship.

We value the sense of community the whole school brings, from before-school activities offered across the arts to the activities within the actual classroom. We really appreciate that students get a mixture of hands-on activities and learning that is tailored to each child. The teachers at Monarch Annapolis really help our children grow. The teachers let students explore and suggest things – it is not the rigid experience we have had with schools in the past.

When Erin was younger, she was afraid to ask questions. She has a bit of the perfectionist in her and doing homework could be a tearful experience. I’ve seen a big difference since she has been at Monarch. She has embraced the growth mindset and has learned it is okay to make a mistake – she can fix it and make it better. Watching her blossom at Monarch has made me eternally grateful for the sense of community the administration and staff have instilled throughout the entire school.

Paperwork and requirements for prekindergarten/kindergarten:

- Original birth certificate
- Social Security number is optional
- Two proofs of residency*
- Copy of immunization record
- Kindergarten: must be 5 years old on or before Sept. 1
- Prekindergarten: must be 4 years old on or before Sept. 1; eligibility subject to state enrollment/income criteria

**1-valid rental agreement, deed or mortgage document issued within 60 days AND 2-current utility/cable bill, bank statement, paystub, etc.)*
